POSTING WITHOUT PERMISSION IS NOT FREEDOM – IT'S A CRIME.

When someone uploads or forwards your picture without asking, it's not just disrespectful — it's a violation of your privacy and dignity.

Under Malaysian law, sharing photos or videos of someone without their consent, especially in a way that humiliates, harasses, or misleads others, can amount to a criminal offence.


GO TO THE NEAREST POLICE STATION (BALAI POLIS) AND MAKE A REPORT.
